Dave is a long-time member of the club, I recently came across TMRA membership lists for 1978 and 1980; Dave's on the 1980 list but not the 1978, so he joined either in 1979 or 1980 - congratulations to Dave for a well deserved award.

September is also the month in which we elect officers, not always new ones as we seem to have difficulty in persuading members to run for office. The Tech Committee and the Equipment Manager (me - anyone else like to take over that position - main responsibility is storing few items of stuff in your basement ?) want to update the inventory of club equipment. We know where practically all of it is, but a few items stray from time to time - such as at Field Day: I haven't seen our Radio Shack megaphone for quite a while. Some things get purchased for the Hamfest or Field day but never get into our inventory records. Going back to the club rosters of 1978 and 1980 - there are several current TMRA members listed on the 1978 roster - I'll put the list together for the next TMRA newsletter so we can recognize those with 30+ years' of supporting the club.

Howard was a member of the Board of Trustees and an active Volunteer Examiner, both for the TMRA monthly exam sessions and his own VE group in the Swanton/Delta area. As with all our deceased members, a donation to an organization of the family's choice has been made by TMRA in his memory.
