If you've been at any of the recent TMRA meetings, you've probably heard at least bits and pieces about upcoming changes to the TMRA website, [www.tmrahamradio.org](http://www.tmrahamradio.org). The changes will be slow, and will likely cover the course of the rest of the year, and beyond. It will not be a sudden change-over like the ARRL site (which went off without a hitch right? hi hi), it'll be more of a series of updates and upgrades. To date we've added a new calendar setup utilizing the Google calendar system, and we've transferred our domain name to provide us with a bit more control over it. Soon we'll also be moving the website hosting itself, i.e., the space the website is actually occupying, from our existing host to another. Our existing host, Buckeye, has been very generous over the years, providing us with free web space. However, with advances in technology we're finding that it's time to expand. Therefore we'll be moving to a web host which provides more services which will in turn allow TMRA to offer more via our website.

What kinds of services? There have been a lot of ideas tossed around recently. One major item will be a way for club members to "log in" to the site and manage their personal contact information directly. For example, if you move or change your e-mail address or phone number, you will be able to log in and change that information directly on the site. You'll also be able to choose between different types of e-mail lists/alerts you'd like to receive. An example of this will be this newsletter. You'll be able to choose if you want it directly e-mailed as an attachment, if you just want a notification it's available, or if you don't wish to be notified at all. Other examples may be if you wish to receive e-mail reminders about upcoming events (Field Day, Hamfest, general meetings, etc...).

Other possibilities include:

- A picture gallery
- A Wiki (an information/knowledge-base for the uninitiated, a place to share information in a more structured fashion than a forum)
- Forums

So, we've got a lot in store. It's going to be an exciting time. At future meetings we'll solicit the membership for more ideas and suggestions. For now, however, we'll be concentrating on getting the site switched over to the new web host, and building the foundation of the new site.
