Proposed changes in TMRA Bylaws

SECTION II. MEMBERSHIP.

1. The membership of the Toledo Mobile Radio Association, Inc., hereinafter referred to as the Association, consists of those persons who are received into membership and continue in good standing. i.e., a person or organization in good standing is regarded as having complied with all their explicit obligations, while not being subject to any form of sanction, suspension or disciplinary censure."

Any amateur radio operator or individuals interested in amateur radio shall be eligible for membership. The membership year is the year July 1st - June 30th. Active members in good standing will receive a membership card, if requested, provided by the Association.

SECTION VI. OFFICERS.

- 2. The President shall preside at all General meetings of the Association and shall be present at the Executive Committee Meetings.
 - e If the President is unable or unwilling to complete his term of office, s/he shall be replaced by the Vice-President according to the provisions of Section VI, Paragraph 3e.
- 3. The Vice-President:
 - a. In the absence of the President at any regularly scheduled General meeting of the Association or Executive Committee, the Vice-President shall perform the President's duties, and in the absence of both the President and Vice-President, such officer as may be present shall preside and assume the duties of the President.
 - e. In the event the President is unable or unwilling to complete his term of office, the Vice-President will immediately become President subject to the following:
 - (i) The Executive Committee shall serve as a Nominating Committee and call for an election of a new Vice-President at a regularly scheduled general meeting of the Association within sixty (60) days of the vacancy.

Renumber the following paragraphs

- 4. The Secretary
 - Shall be a member, ex officio, of the Budget Committee, having an equal vote.
- The Treasurer.
 - Shall have been a full member of the Association in good standing for a period of not less than one
 (1) year, preferably for at least three (3) prior to the date of election to the office.
- The Bursar
- Except as stipulated in Items VI, 2e and VI, 3e and 3e(i) above, if a vacancy occurs in an elected office, the
 Executive Committee shall appoint a full member of the Association, with his/her agreement, to fill the
 remainder of that Officer's term.
- a. If no full member of the Association who meets all the qualifications of office is willing to serve, then the Executive Committee, using its best judgement, may choose any full member wiling to serve.
- b. Any officer chosen under the provisions of this paragraph shall be titled as "Acting" (eg.: Acting Secretary).

SECTION IX. NOMINATION AND ELECTION.

3. To qualify for nomination for any office in the Association requires:


The ARES monthly meeting is the 4th Saturday of each month.

Ground Loop Isolators

A ground loop is basically what happens when two separate devices (A and B) are connected to ground through different paths and then also connected to each other by another path, creating a loop. If you connect an earphone jack from an HF radio to a computer's microphone or line input with a cable, both ground connectors go to earth ground, but they get there through different paths. Now you have also connected them through the ground lead on a cable. This leads to either hum or audio distortion. There are other situations where there is a voltage difference between grounds for a variety of reasons and result in hum or other audio distortion.



So, if you do have annoying hum or distortion when connecting the audio of different devices, you have a couple of choices. Ground loop isolators contain small audio transformers, typically 600 ohm at 1000 Hz. The first two pictures below show ground loop isolators where all leads are separate on both sides of the transformers. Therefore, the ground leads are isolated and there is no possibility of a loop. Since the

Therefore, the ground leads are isolated and there is no possibility of a loop. Since the last one pictured uses 1/8 inch connectors for stereo, the ground leads for the left and right channels are connected on either side but not connected together. The low level audio passes through the small transformers. As you see, ground loop isolators are usually stereo and cost between ten and twenty dollars.








I looked at the situation when there is a cable between the earphone jack and a computer amplifier/speaker that has its own switching supply. I tried to determine if there was a direct connection between either terminal of the power supply and the ground or hot lead on the amplifier (using a meter) and there was none. I tried this with two different computer amplifier/speakers. This is probably because a DC blocking capacitor is present in both the hot lead and ground lead of the computer amplifier/speaker.

So either approach, an isolator or a cheap computer amplifier/ speaker, may improve your audio is you have hum. I had a strange experience when I used one side (the black leads) of a ground loop isolator (the top one) between a radio and a computer. I was recording audio from the radio doing this. Then I used the other side of the isolator (the read leads) between the headphone output of the same computer and an amplifier that I had built. So, one side of the isolator (from the computer output) passed a tiny amount of audio to the input, transformer to transformer. There was no feedback because of delays within the PC. But this arrangement produced a steady train of weak echoes of the audio from the radio. So I just bought another, separate group loop isolator!



The new Club Grants program will help clubs more easily provide and expand their important services.

Beginning in April, amateur radio clubs will be able to apply for these grants by filling out a simple form on the ARRL website. The ARRL Foundation will evaluate the grant proposals. The Foundation was established in 1973 to advance the art, science, and societal benefits of the amateur radio service by awarding financial grants

and scholarships to individuals and organizations in support of their charitable, educational, and scientific efforts.
